Grassland Management

Large herds of Elk and Antelope once roamed the hills of California. These herds were moved by predators and migration routes which maintained the open grassland and all the biodiversity that goes along with that grassland. With the absence of the large herd animals, we can use cattle to maintain the grass land by moving them from pasture to pasture so that over-grazing never occurs. This in turn, helps the native plant and animal species to thrive and reduces the danger of uncontrollable fires by reducing the amount of residual dry matter. "By using grazing and animal impact on our planet's vast rangelands to restore lands to health and increase organic matter in soils, we can reverse the desertification (restore biodiversity) that has occurred. This is accomplished by herds of livestock managed in a way that simulates the behavior of the great wild herds in the presence of predators" Allan Savory www.holisticmanagement.org

Share Options

At this point we only offer shares once a year. Once we are able to store meat for the community we can offer portions throughout the year. The shares will be ready when the animals and the grass are ready, typically mid-late summer. This largely depends on what the season has in store for us. The portion sizes are whole, half and split-half. You will receive the beef in individually wrapped and labeled packages, ready to put into your freezer. The meat will be delivered to a centrally located pick-up spot.
